Sierra Nevada Academy Charter School and the Washoe County School District employs the Multi-Tiered System of Support as a preventative, supportive and consistent instructional and motivational model to deter negative student behaviors. If student behavior falls below expectations, the following behavioral guidelines will be used by school administrators to determine consequences for student behavior violations. In all instances, these guidelines may be modified contingent upon the level of severity of the incident and aligned with age, developmental level and other extenuating circumstances. The guidelines are applicable to incidents which occur at school; travel to and from school, during lunch, and while involved in school sponsored-activities. In all circumstances, school administrators will make decisions based upon the health, safety and welfare of all students while keeping the focus on student success and the “Pathway” to graduation. Any behavioral or disciplinary related actions or sanctions being taken with any student who is participating in a program of Special Education, must comply with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and Nevada Administrative Code.

Contingent upon the severity and frequency of all behaviors a Functional Behavioral Assessment and behavioral intervention plan should be developed.

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
